Careers provision at Trafalgar School is comprehensive and ambitious. Every student participates in career related learning, equipping them with the knowledge, skills and experiences to make informed choices about their future careers. We prepare students to be successful in life beyond education and to achieve in a competitive job market where leaders are expected to be lifelong learners.

We aim to raise students' aspirations, encourage them to step out of their comfort zones and help guide them into a wide range of enjoyable career pathways. Clear information and understanding ensures our students have the self-knowledge, drive and determination to aim high.

We have a strong focus on careers and employability, with excellent community links and a wide network of external support. Our Careers Hub is continually developing, offering a diverse range of resources, information and advice. Students are supported to see the relevance of their studies to their future careers and set themselves clear careers goals. They understand that their school life is a period of preparation and a starting point for adventures into lifelong careers.

# Aims & Objectives:

- To provide access to impartial, independent and personalised careers education, information, advice and guidance for all students.
- Implement a curriculum incorporating careers, employability skills and enterprise education for all students, enhanced by Personal Development Days.
- To ensure explicit links between individual subjects' schemes of learning and the careers strategy are developed by Curriculum Enrichment leaders.
- Provide appropriate resources to record and evaluate students' careers experiences which will support the creation of their CV/electronic profile.
- To ensure students have the knowledge and understanding of how education has equipped them with desirable skills, behaviours and attitudes as they progress into adulthood becoming economically aware and demonstrating Trafalgar core values.
- To ensure access to our Careers Hub for all stakeholders, provide a full range of career information, guidance and development pathways.
- To ensure aspirational and meaningful work experience placements for all Year 10 students.
- To be developmentally appropriate and relevant at each key stage.
- To meet the diverse needs of all learners.
- Assign a governor with responsibility for ensuring the school supports students to relate their learning to careers and the world of work from an early age.

## **Monitoring and Evaluation:**

- The careers strategy will be updated annually and monitored by the Assistant Headteacher: Personal Development and Wellbeing.
- Curriculum Leaders and Curriculum Enrichment Leaders are responsible for ensuring subject specific careers education is incorporated into planning.
- The 'Compass Careers Benchmark Tool' will form a key part in reviewing the provision on offer at Trafalgar School, along with the use of UNIfrog to ensure all students have equal opportunities to career related learning and encounters.
- The careers strategy will be shared at reviewed at both leadership and governors' meetings to provide challenge and support.

## **Stakeholder and Employee Engagement:**

Trafalgar School continues to nurture working relationships with: Barclays life skills; SERCO; Formaplex; Royal Navy; UTC; Sailing organisations; The Police and other front-line services; local colleges, technical providers and universities, including the University of Oxford. This is to explore as many opportunities as possible with our students with the overriding aim of opening their eyes to the world of possibilities before them. We firmly believe in raising students' aspirations through regular experiences outside of the everyday curriculum and our careers provision forms an important part of this.

#### Student entitlement:

All students in Years 8-13 are entitled:

- Current and relevant, unbiased information on future learning and training, careers and labour market information;
- to have the opportunities to engage in meaningful conversations about their futures with their teachers, tutors and external providers;
- to find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeship opportunities as part of a careers programme which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point;
- to hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships – through options events, assemblies, group discussions and taster events;
- to understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses.
